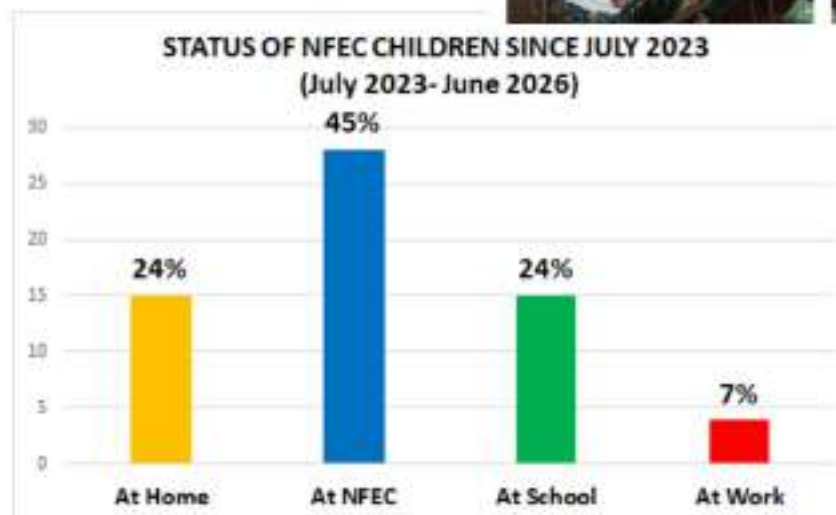

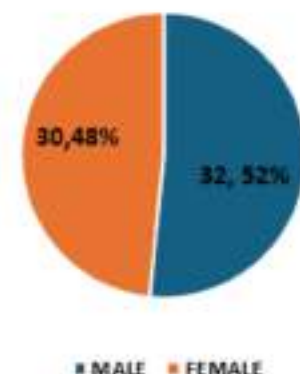
WPTGF in collaboration with AWARD held a seminar on "Christian Values & Women Protection Laws in Pakistan". During the session the participants explored the essence of Christian values such as wisdom, faithfulness, perseverance, consistency, and the principle of loving thy neighbor. Speakers also explained in detail the Women Protection Laws in Pakistan, aiming to empower women and girls with the knowledge and confidence to thrive fearlessly in the country. The perspective of being faithful with their spouses was highly appreciated by women. Ms. Asma Riaz, the Advocate High Court, deals with domestic criminal cases. She articulated, Constitution of Pakistan is the mother law and it guarantees protection of women rights in the country. She further shared laws in Pakistan for women protection.

WPTGF NON-FORMAL EDUCATION CENTRE (NFEC)

WPTG Foundation is giving free primary education to out of school children. Currently, 35 children are studying with us, our teachers provide friendly environment to children for , learning and sharing their thoughts with us. We also give them peace and interfaith harmony education. The age range of these children is 4 to 14. We are helping them to explore what they want to become when they grow up.

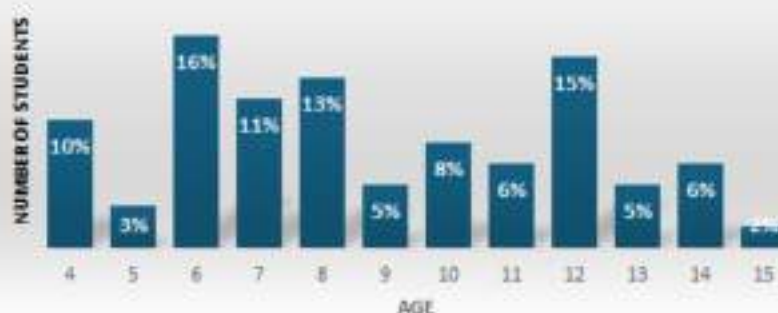


GENDERWISE STATISTICS



The survey has revealed that since July 2023, WPTGF has taught 62 children, out of which 45% are still studying at NFEC, 24% have joined schools, 6% are at work and 24% are at their homes because they are not able to afford their transportation to reach to the centre. The 62 children include 48% females and 52% males. Our achievement is 24% children who have enrolled in the mainstream schools after initiating their studies with us.

AGEWISE PERCENTAGE OF NFEC STUDENTS



The graph Agewise percentatge of NFEC Students indicates children's age range from 4 to 15. The highest number of out of school children belonging to age 6, 8 and 12 have been enrolled to NFEC. They face huge financial problems reflecting in their weak physical health. At present 28 children are studying at the centre.

WPTGF MEETING WITH FR. BONNIE MENDIS



WPTGF team including Ms. Kiran Peter, (ED), Mr. Aaron Rowan Bob and Ms. Saleema Munir the Development Sector Professional met Fr. Bonnie Mendis at the Pastoral Centre, Lalazar on April 2, 2025. We had a good discussion on the promotion of social cohesion and interfaith harmony in the country through education and community mobilization. We discussed about role of development in peacebuilding which is a dire need of Pakistan in current times.

NEED ASSESSMENT OF WOMEN LIVING IN SLUMS

WPTGF conducted a need assessment of women residing in slum areas of Rawalpindi in April 2025. The study revealed that majority of the women residing in these areas are illiterate due to poverty and lack of awareness of their parents and elders to educate their children. These women want to learn skills and start up their businesses. The second need of these slum areas is provision of scholarships to their children to continue their studies. Most of the girls and boys are unable to continue their education because their parents cannot afford higher studies expenses. There is a great need to uplift these women and youth through the provision of skills and educational scholarships.



INTERVIEW - RESEARCH STUDY ON PUNJAB PRIMARY LEVEL CURRICULUM



WPTGF in collaboration with Action for Impact organization held an interview on "Analysis of Punjab Primary Level Textbooks" of Ms. Saleema Munir, a Development Sector Professional on March 29, 2025 at her residence, in Lalazar Rawalpindi. Ms. Kiran Peter, the Executive Director of WPTGF shared with her the research study two days before to enable her to come up with good suggestions and recommendations regarding it. She admired the research and emphasized the importance of inclusive education that respects all religions and supports children's emotional development.

She stressed on the need for practical implementation of values such as empathy, compassion, tolerance along with cultural promotion, national unity, and economic growth to evolve into a pluralistic nation.

WPTGF Sewing Centre for Women and Girls (SDG 8)



WPTGF is running a Sewing Centre for underprivileged women and girls to enable them to learn sewing and stitching by attending a 6-months course. A fashion designer with 25 years of experience in this field has been hired. The classes are held from Monday to Friday from 11a.m. to 1p.m. We are training 10 women in the sewing and stitching skills at present, they feel happy to come to the centre, meet, talk and learn.

SPROUTING PEACEFUL MINDS THROUGH KITCHEN GARDENING (SDG 13)



WPTG Foundation initiated "Sprouting Peaceful Minds through Kitchen Gardening" project in December 2023 in collaboration with REEDs (organization). A total of 94 households were mobilized on initiating and maintaining their kitchen garden as it will improve the quality of air with greater amount of oxygen in the air. It will also reduce growing food insecurity in Pakistan.

WPTGF conducted a monitoring visit in June 2024 and women have reported that Kitchen Gardening has reduced their grocery bill and also helped them to have good mood because they remain busy in taking care of the plants. This project is also helping the care takers of kitchen gardens to lessen their depression.
