WPTGF CELEBRATED CHRISTMAS WITH COMMUNITY MEMBERS (SDG 16)



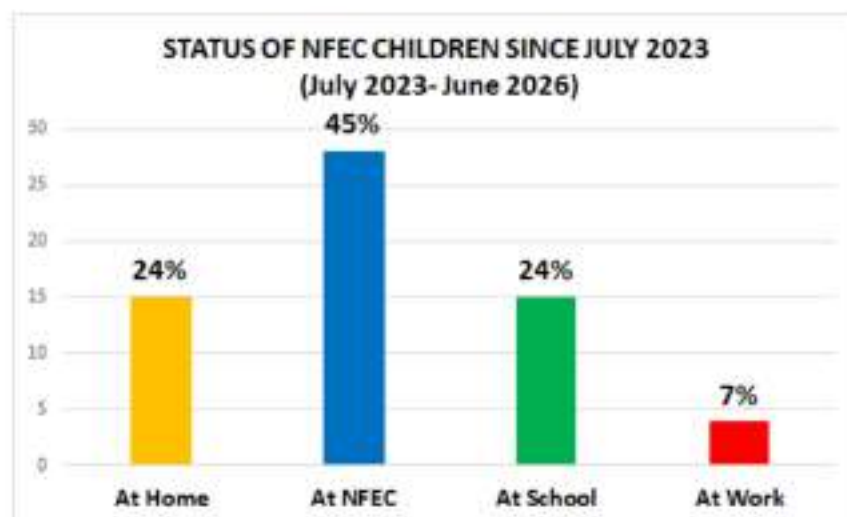

WPTGF NON-FORMAL EDUCATION CENTRE (NFEC) CHILD PROTECTION AWARENESS SESSION WITH PARENTS (SDG 4)



Mrs. Asma Nawab from Saanjh Preet organization conducted an awareness session with parents to make them aware about Child Protection. She shared with the parents that violence is of two types physical and psychological, when parents use harsh words for their children and make them depressed, this is psychological violence. Also, we need to listen to our children carefully when they report about any unusual things being done with them by relatives or other people. Parents prime responsibility is to take care of their children.

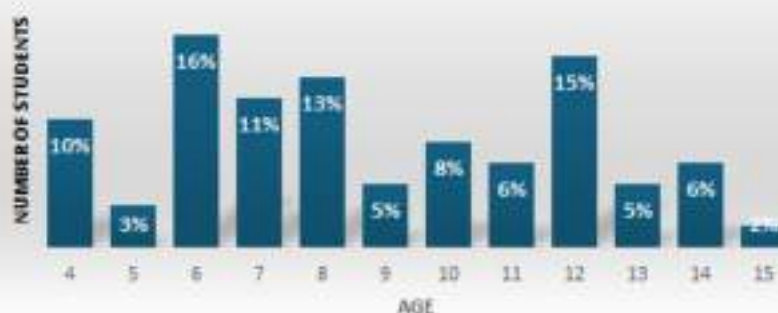


GENDERWISE STATISTICS



The survey has revealed that since July 2023, WPTGF has taught 62 children, out of which 45% are still studying at NFEC, 24% have joined schools, 6% are at work and 24% are at their homes because they are not able to afford their transportation to reach to the centre. The 62 children include 48% females and 52% males. Our achievement is 24% children who have enrolled in the mainstream schools after initiating their studies with us.

AGEWISE PERCENTAGE OF NFEC STUDENTS



The graph Age-wise percentage of NFEC Students indicates children's age range from 4 to 15. The highest number of out of school children belonging to age 6, 8 and 12 have been enrolled to NFEC. They face huge financial problems reflecting in their weak physical health. At present 28 children are studying at the centre.

MEETING WITH PRIVATE SCHOOL TEACHERS ON PUNJAB PRIMARY LEVEL CURRICULUM



WPTGF in collaboration with Action for Impact conducted meeting with primary level private school teachers on Punjab primary level curriculum to share their experience and learnings teaching at this level. They were also asked how do they treat diverse faith children at schools. The teachers highlighted the content in the curriculum creating a segregation among majority and minority children, they proposed that schools should teach children their own religious education. They emphasized that Muslim children should study Islamiat, Christians biblical education and children belonging to other religions should be given their own religious education. Secondly, the element of respect should be taught to children and importance of acceptance of diversity needs to be explained to children in detail. In schools the children should be given the concept of citizenship and explained well that all citizens are equal in a State, there is no one superior than the other.

WPTGF is running a Sewing Centre for underprivileged women and girls to enable them to learn sewing and stitching by attending a 6-months course. A fashion designer with 25 years of experience in this field has been hired. The classes are held from Monday to Friday from 11a.m. to 1p.m. We are training 10 women in the sewing and stitching skills at present, they feel happy to come to the centre, meet, talk and learn.

We also stitch women and girls suits and sarees in low prices, please contact us if you would want to get your suits or Sarees stitched.

Besides, learning the skills the girls also get peace education and learn how to resolve conflicts at household level and community level. We believe women are important because they have very close connection with their children as birth givers and bringing them up. Women can transform the mindsets of their family members and children to promote peace in their surroundings.



SPROUTING PEACEFUL MINDS THROUGH KITCHEN GARDENING (SDG 13)



WPTG Foundation initiated "Sprouting Peaceful Minds through Kitchen Gardening" project in December 2023 in collaboration with REEDs (organization). A total of 94 households were mobilized on initiating and maintaining their kitchen garden as it will improve the quality of air with greater amount of oxygen in the air. It will also reduce growing food insecurity in Pakistan.

WPTGF conducted a monitoring visit in June 2024 and women have reported that Kitchen Gardening has reduced their grocery bill and also helped them to have good mood because they remain busy in taking care of the plants. This project is also helping the care takers of kitchen gardens to lessen their depression.
