It emphasizes community participation, collaboration, and locally driven solutions to create long-term social impact. The Executive Director of Weaving People To Grow Foundation attended a training program conducted by HIVE, which enhanced institutional capacity and understanding of participatory and innovative development approaches. As a result of this engagement, HIVE and WPTGF have collaborated on a project Soil to Solidarity to empower women as peace Ambassadors of their areas and earn through kitchen gardening.

AWARENESS SESSION: KITCHEN GARDENING A TOOL FOR PEACEBUILDING AND BUSINESS IN ISLAMABAD



WPTGF in collaboration with HIVE Pakistan successfully held an inspiring Kitchen Gardening Awareness Session in Madina Town, Islamabad on November 29, 2025, under the project "From Soil to Solidarity: Empowering Vulnerable Women Through Peacebuilding Kitchen Gardening Cooperative in Pakistan." The session brought together 70 women from the community to learn how kitchen gardening can become a source of peace, income, and climate conservation. Participants explored how small home gardens not only improve household nutrition but also promote interfaith harmony, economic resilience, and a healthier environment. AWARENESS SESSION: KITCHEN GARDENING A TOOL FOR PEACEBUILDING AND BUSINESS IN RAWALPINDI

Weaving People to Grow Foundation (WPTGF), in collaboration with HIVE Pakistan, successfully organized an awareness session titled “Kitchen Gardening: A Tool for Peacebuilding and Business” on December 6, 2025 at its office in Lakurti, Rawalpindi. The session was conducted under the project “From Soil to Solidarity: Empowering Vulnerable Women Through Peacebuilding Kitchen Gardening Cooperative in Pakistan.”

The event brought together 85 women from vulnerable communities, peace advocates, and development professionals to explore how kitchen gardening can become a catalyst for peacebuilding, climate conservation, and financial empowerment.

The session began with registration and an interfaith prayer led by Ms. Kiran Peter, who also welcomed all guests and participants. She emphasized the vision of HIVE Pakistan and WPTGF, highlighting the transformative role that peace-centered livelihood initiatives can play for marginalized women in Pakistan.

Senior development sector professional Ms. Saleema Munir delivered an insightful session on Kitchen Gardening and Climate, explaining how sustainable agricultural practices improve climate quality, promote green living, and support community resilience.

Another impactful session on Kitchen Gardening and Business was facilitated by Mr. George Chughtai, who discussed how women can convert small-scale gardening into viable income-generating activities. He emphasized the role of entrepreneurship in strengthening household economies and fostering long-term stability.

Business owner Mr. Usman Raza shared practical insights on Business Marketing, illustrating how proper marketing strategies can enhance visibility, increase sales, and support small-scale women-led enterprises



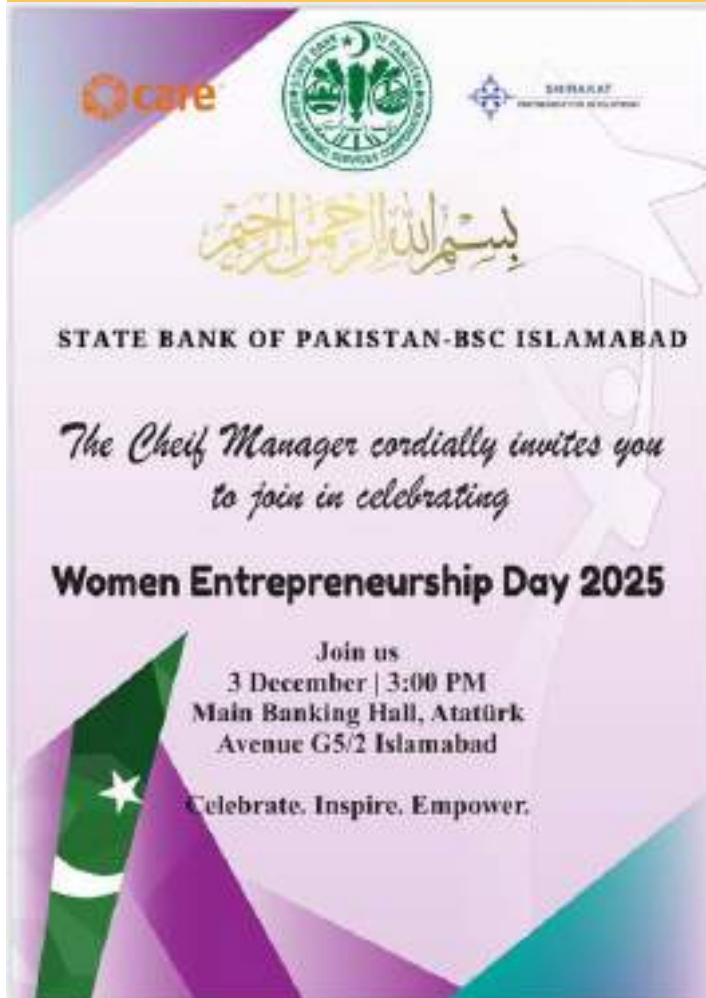

A fashion designer with 25 years of experience in this field has been hired. The classes are held from Monday to Friday from 11a.m. to 1p.m. We are training 10 women in the sewing and stitching skills at present, they feel happy to come to the centre, meet, talk and learn.

We also stitch women and girls suits and sarees in low prices, please contact us if you would want to get your suits or Sarees stitched.

Besides, learning the skills the girls also get peace education and learn how to resolve conflicts at household level and community level. We believe women are important because they have very close connection with their children as birth givers and bringing them up. Women can transform the mindsets of their family members and children to promote peace in their surroundings.

SPROUTING PEACEFUL MINDS THROUGH KITCHEN GARDENING (SDG 13)



WPTG Foundation initiated “Sprouting Peaceful Minds through Kitchen Gardening” project in December 2023 in collaboration with REEDs (organization). A total of 94 households were mobilized on initiating and maintaining their kitchen garden as it will improve the quality of air with greater amount of oxygen in the air. It will also reduce growing food insecurity in Pakistan.

WPTGF conducted a monitoring visit to this kitchen garden in November 2025 and women have reported that Kitchen Gardening has reduced their grocery bill and also helped them to have good mood because they remain busy in taking care of the plants. This project is also helping the care takers of kitchen gardens to lessen their depression.
