We started our journey in 2021 and had several face-to-face and virtual discussions to establish Weaving People to Grow Foundation (WPTG Foundation). It is a non-profit development organization initially working in the Rawalpindi district of Pakistan with a strong focus on values of Respect, Dignity, Accountability, Transparency and Accountability. WPTGF is registered under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 with Joint Stock Companies. At the inception of WPTG Foundation, we developed its 5 years strategic plan aligned with Pakistan Vision 2023 and United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and we are glad that we are with our progressing in attaining our objectives as per the strategic plan. The tribute goes to our hardworking and focused Board Members, Donors, Colleagues, Advisors, Staff Members Volunteer Professionals, Women Network and Youth Network who are loyal to the vision of the organization.

We are endeavoring to achieve our vision by eliminating injustice and poverty within financially poor families because we believe injustice caused at any level harms systems and outcomes of institutions, families and individuals. Secondly, along with injustice, poverty pushes individuals to disturb peace within themselves and in the outside environment.

We are glad that in the year 2023 we have been able to launch a Non-Formal Education Centre for Out of School Children and 24 children out of 62 children have studied from us have been enrolled in the mainstream schools, 1 student being benefited from our scholarship project has completed her 4 semesters, 8 underprivileged women out of 15 have started earning as beauticians in their communities, distributed free warm clothes among 2000 financially poor people, 5 households have reported in reduction of their grocery bills due kitchen gardening,

WPTG Foundation encourages a culture of observation, reflection, and continuous improvement because we believe this practice not only helps improve the quality of our programs but also enables learning and sustainable growth of our teams and beneficiaries.

Once again, I am thankful for the cooperation of all our supporters in promotion of peaceful coexistence in Pakistan.

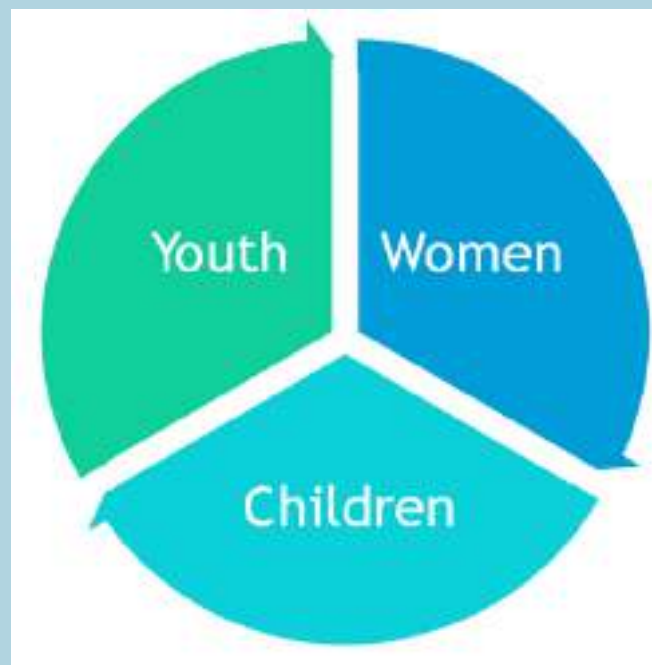

THEMATIC AREA: SOCIAL COHESION SDG 16



WPTG Foundation in collaboration with Action for Impact organization under the project “Parenting Matters for Interfaith Harmony” is educating parents and community members on raising their children with the concept of accepting other religions, sects and people. Pakistan lacks platforms that help and educate young parents to train their children for acceptance of diversity in the country. We have developed two Interfaith Harmony Committees working in Rawalpindi and Islamabad for the promotion of interfaith harmony in the twin cities. The members of the committees are diverse faith, sects and denominations. A total of 44 community members (families) including Muslim, Christian and Hindu religious leaders, men, women and youth working to promote peace and interfaith within their homes and neighborhood. We are also working with children under the project to transform their mindsets to live in harmony with people having different ideologies, thoughts, religions, sects and denominations. We mobilize a total of 257 children, parents and community members to respect people having different religions than you in eight months.

WPTG Foundation in collaboration with Alkhidmat Foundation have distributed free clothes, Food bags and winter kits including quilts, pillows and mattresses among 2500 financially poor households headed by widows, unemployed families and families suffering from diseases with a monthly household income below PKR 30,000.

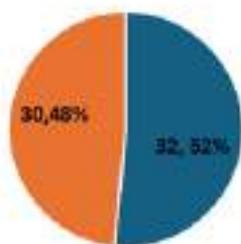

THEMATIC AREA: PROMOTION OF EDUCATION SDG 4



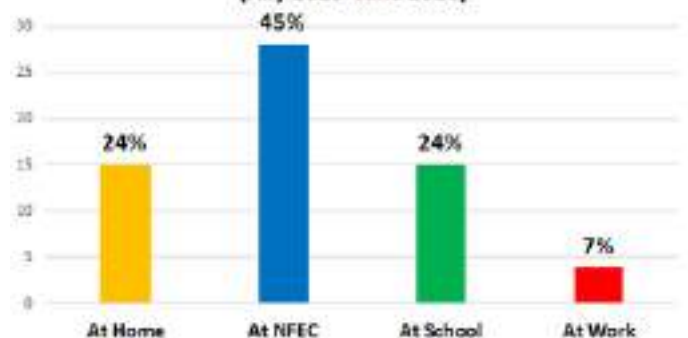
WPTG Foundation Non-Formal Education Centre gives free education to out of school children belonging to diverse religions and sects. We give them peace sessions on weekly basis to transform their attitudes towards acceptance of diversity, tolerance, gender equality, compassion, respecting other's religions and building up good relationships with one another for the promotion of peace and harmony within the country. In October 2024, our team conducted a survey of the students who have left NFEC or are presently studying at the centre. The survey has revealed that since July 2023, we have taught 62 children, out of which 45% are still studying at NFEC, 24% have joined schools 🎒, 6% are at work and 24% are at their homes because they are not able to afford their transportation to reach to the centre. The 62 children include 48% females and 52% males. Our achievement is 24% children who have enrolled in the mainstream schools after initiating their studies with us.

WPTGF is running a Sewing Centre for underprivileged women and girls to enable them to learn sewing and stitching by attending a 6-months course. A fashion designer with 25 years of experience in this field has been hired. The classes are held from Monday to Wednesday from 11a.m. to 1p.m. Currently, the admissions are open for the sewing centre. .

WPTC Foundation initiated "Sprouting Peaceful Minds through Kitchen Gardening" project in December 2023 in collaboration with REEDS (organization). A total of 94 households were mobilized on initiating and maintaining their kitchen garden as it will improve the quality of air with greater amount of oxygen in the air. It will also reduce growing food insecurity in Pakistan.

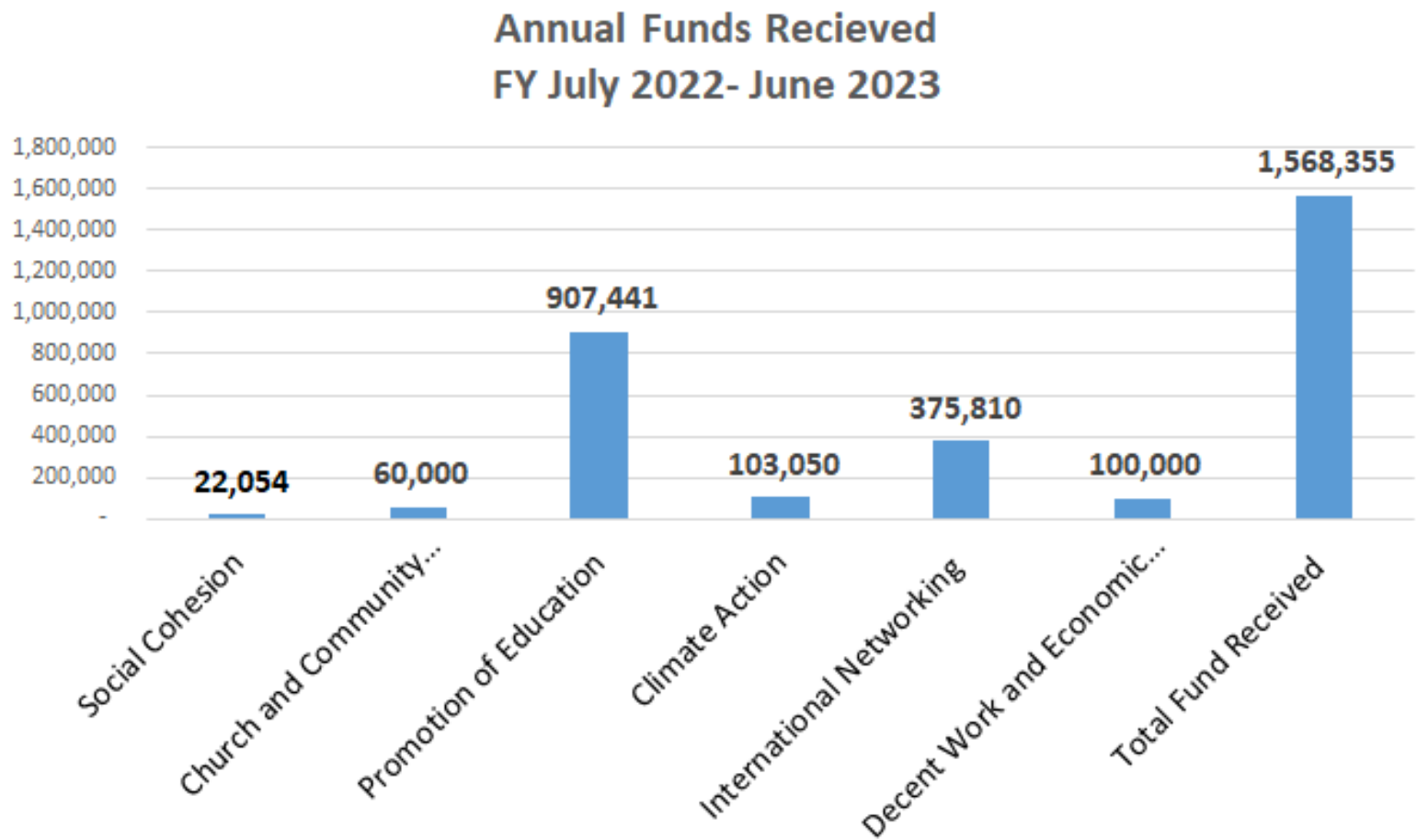
WPTGF conducted a monitoring visit in June 2024 and women have reported that Kitchen Gardening has reduced their grocery bill and also helped them to have good mood because they remain busy in taking care of the plants. This project is also helping the care takers of kitchen gardens to lessen their depression.
